Rally Day: Uroom

As I prepared for this article, I searched on the internet with the word "Rally" and looked for images. The result in a few different search sites produced the same result.

Hundreds, yes literally hundreds of pictures of cars, trucks, motorcycles, and other wheeled Vehicles. So, if I did not know any better, I would assume from this visual search that the word "Rally" must mean a Vehicular event of some sort. Rally must equal some type of gathering of Vehicles and therefore the people who race, collect, show, observe or cheer for their favorites.

Our own "Rally Day" is fast approaching (Sept. 10). Using the above understanding of Rally, I am expecting that we will have a parking lot full of Vehicles on our Rally Day. Yes, cars, truck, SUV's, perhaps even a few motorcycles, horses, or even a motorhome. Does that sound about right to you? Yes?! No?! Maybe?! Huh?!

We are not going to have a race or a car show, (although that would be a good idea for another year on **Rally Day**). We are not planning to gather around outside among the many **Vehicles** and vote for the best one, with hoods open, looking at motors and admiring paint jobs. But, we are going to use our **Vehicles** to get us to **Risen Christ Lutheran Church** for our **Rally Day**. This **Rally Day** is much more important than any of the other types of "**Rally**" events because we are going to **Rally** together with our focus upon God's **Spirit-filled Word of truth and life.**

Before I lose the car buffs among the readers, I will discuss the word "**Vehicle**" a little bit more. The origin of the word is mid-16th century the French word "vehere" meaning "to carry". **Vehicle** today has as one of the definitions: "<u>a thing used to express, embody or fulfill something</u>." As we see this expanded definition we realize that God's Church is a **Vehicle**, in that it is used to <u>embody</u>, express and deliver God's truth and love to all humans of every age.

One of the words in the definition for **Vehicle** is the word "Embody,", which means "to be an expression of or give a tangible or visible form to thought, idea, teaching, etc. ² This brings us perfectly, then to the church, the Body of Christ. As God's Holy Spirit guides the Apostle Paul to write, "Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it." So, we see then, that we are literally called the Body of Christ and are called and empowered to embody the love of Jesus as we move daily through life. The church then is indeed a **Vehicle** for delivering and embodying God's message of salvation by grace, through faith in Christ. So, we **Rally**!



Rally Day is a day the that would have us <u>gathering</u> as brothers and sisters in Christ; in and around the **Vehicle** that is God's Church. We gather on Sept. 10 for the following:

for Fun, Food, and Fellowship (and pancakes),

to invite others to join our time together for fellowship and growth,

to jump start our Sunday school for the fall season,

to bring together our young ones

for a time to stress the value and importance of His Holy Word of life,

so that His Holy Spirit would work mightily,

through song and prayer

through the blessing of Holy Baptism, to create faith in an infant

To strengthen and sustain saving faith,

Through the reading and preaching of His Holy Word,

through His sacrament of the Body and Blood of Jesus

through the fellowship of believers as we encourage one another,

through time in prayer and contemplation,

To get our hearts, lives and minds changed and encouraged by His Holy Spirit, so that we are eager for study – beyond our 70 minutes or so of worship.

Our theme for **Rally Day** is "**Everyone**" from Romans 10:13 which says, "**Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved**." If you know someone who needs to know and trust the love of Jesus Christ, invite them for pancakes on September 10. Invite them for Sunday School or for Adult Bible Class starting on September 17. If you invited them in the past and they said "no thank you" try again. If they used to come but have wandered away, invite them again. It is time to **Rally**. Let this **Rally** be a new start. Let the **Vehicle** of God's church in this place carry you forward in your faith growth and development. **Rally Day**, however, can't be the only day this happens. **Rally Day** is a jump start. A new beginning. The spirit of this day <u>needs to be **continued**</u> throughout the year ahead. **Continue** inviting. **Continue** encountering and encouraging. **Continue** studying, surrendering, and serving. **Continue** gathering and growing. **Continue** praising, praying, and participating in worship.

Let the **Rally** begin and **Continue** for **Everyone**.

When asked where she would choose to travel, if she could go anywhere in the world, she said she would like to visit Israel and learn more about biblical history.




Connections Report


Stewardship Report

At Risen Christ you have recently provided the funds to complete a huge project, replacing our Security System and updating our Fire Alarm. Even though the project required additional monies totaling \$3000, your generous gifts came through and donations covered what was needed to finish.

Our new challenge is to eliminate the budget deficit of \$7000 from last year. To make it as easy as possible to donate, your stewardship committee is recycling the left-over envelopes from the Fire Alarm Drive. You will find these envelopes on the table to the left as you enter the Sanctuary. They are white with green writing that says "Deficit". Please add your name or envelope number and place in the offering plate. A few envelopes have been placed in some of the pews.

Just as we have done in the past, the RCLC congregation can eliminate this deficit with large and small gifts.



Outreach Report

Greetings from the Risen Christ Pantry crew. The majority of our clients are seniors. They are living on very fixed incomes and many have health issues. We try to give them balanced nutritious food including meat, vegetables, carbohydrates, and other foods to fill their needs. We had one new lady that is dealing with cancer. She said she felt blessed that she only has one treatment left. Our numbers seem to be leveling off at around forty families. This equals about 100 plus individuals that are not going hungry at least for a while.

In July we spent \$84 which equates to 84 cents per person. We were blessed with being able to purchase whole chickens at 45 cents each. I place the orders early in the month and Chuck and Laura Bern pick the groceries up the Thursday before Pantry day. Their vehicle is usually packed from front to back. They then unload and organize all of the groceries. The Berns also put out signs for the pantry at various intersections.

This month the Fords, Berns, Shraders, Eric Martin, and Phil Sears packed and carried groceries for about 2 hours. Each family receives about 3 bags of groceries plus some non-bagged items.

The Pantry crew feels blessed that the congregation is so supportive. You have helped fill the gaps for food items that Second Harvest has not had in their inventory. This month we are requesting **pancake mix and/or syrup**. We will continue this outreach endeavor with joy in our hearts and praises to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.



RCLS would like your help. You can redirect some of the Ohio Income Tax you pay to the "Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization." Every tax dollar that the school gets from this agency adds funds to the schools' budget. It does not increase the amount you owe.

The Ohio general assembly established the:

OHIO Department of Taxation Scholarship Donation Credit

- Donors who contribute to an SGO are eligible to receive a DOLLAR-for-DOLLAR nonrefundable tax credit up to \$750.00 each.
- The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Ohio (LSGO of Ohio) was established to assist Faith-Based schools in raising funds.
- RCLS is a participating school with LSGOOHIO.com

How can you Participate?

- Look at your State of Ohio income tax return for 2022, form 1040IT and check line 8c. This line shows what you owed in state taxes. If you believe you will owe the state about the same for 2023, this program is for you.
- You can send funds this year to support RCLS by contributing the amount you owe or \$750, which ever is less, to Isgoohio.com.
 Contributors to Isgoohio.com receive a DOLLAR-for-DOLLAR tax credit up to \$750 per person or \$1,500 if filing jointly where each person separately donates up to \$750. Total cannot exceed line 8c of form 1040IT for this tax credit.
- **3**rd Go to Isgoohio.com, click on "Donate Now" then scroll down to "Designation" and select "Risen Christ Lutheran school (Springfield)."
- **4th** LSGO of Ohio will send you a letter accepting your donation. This letter will be filed with your State 1040IT.
- When filing your 2023 Ohio 1040IT, make sure you fill out "2023 Schedule of Credits", Line 15, "Scholarship donation credit (include copies of all required documentation)"

 This redirects the state tax funds to LSGO of Ohio there by increasing your refund or reducing the amount you owe the state.
