ELDERS REPORT PT 1 "I want to see..."

It's already October, which means the harvest will continue and our Reformation celebration comes at end of the month. This year's Gospel reading for Reformation Day (*a Friday*) is from Mark 10:46-52. It tells how a blind beggar named Bartimaeus, heard that Jesus was coming and kept yelling out "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Hearing him, Jesus told him to come, which he eagerly did. Obviously blind, Jesus still asks him the question "What do you want me to do for you?" This might seem like an odd question given the circumstance until you understand that Jesus doesn't ask questions like this to get information. He already knows the answer to his questions. Rather, he asks questions like this to make a point, to drill down to the heart of the circumstances with the person asking, and to bring understanding to those listening. The man's response was "My Master, I want to see." Jesus's reply was "Go, for your faith has healed you." Instantly the man could see, and he chose to follow Jesus.

Notice that Jesus did not ask the man "What do you *need*" but rather "What do you *want*?" The need was obvious. Jesus was looking beyond the man's circumstances and asking him what was in his heart. The man had already confessed to everyone that he knew Jesus to be the Messiah by using the title Son of David. So now Jesus gave him the opportunity to further confess him as "My Master." Bartimaeus was already a disciple, a follower, as much as a blind man could be. It was because of his faith, his confessions, that Jesus healed him. This external healing of the man's body served as an outward confirmation of where the man's heart was. He had a heart of faith... faith in Jesus, his teachings, and who he was.

Faith is not the same as *understanding*. Although he knew that Jesus was Messiah, he did not yet understand what that meant. That day Bartimaeus not only received his physical sight but was more importantly afforded the opportunity to "see" even more. He began following Messiah undoubtedly with a faith the size of a mustard seed. But Jesus was able to take such a small thing and do something miraculous, and undoubtedly was later able to bring understanding to Bartimaeus and others around him because of their faith.



ELDERS REPORT PT 2

God continues to ask today "What do you want from me?" He already knows your answer but wants you to answer it for your own sake. He wants each of us to realize the true nature of our own heart. Does your heart cry out "Master, I want to see"? God wants to reveal himself to you in a very personal, real, and powerful way. God knows that what's on the inside of a person is eternal and what's on their outside is temporal. Although God does not ignore the external, he is focused first and foremost on what's inside a person's heart where faith and trust can reside. Do you want to see and understand him better than you did yesterday; or perhaps to know him for the first time? Do you want him to reveal to you who he is and what he wants to do in your life? It only takes a mustard seed size faith for God to do it. God has promised he would. He is faithful. His heart is bent towards your heart. He has promised that if you ask, it will be given; if you seek, you will find; if you knock, the door will be opened to you. So ask, seek, and knock... and watch God work in your life. It is his desire to do so.

If you have the desire to seek after God, that is the Holy Spirit *already* working in you, stirring your heart to achieve His purposes in your life. Your faith, even as small as an unmatured mustard seed, can move mountains. It *will* move His heart.




STEWARDSHIP REPORT
